



ii. Green Skills Development Programme (GSDP): Gist of Major Achievements

To instil green skills in environment, forest and wildlife sectors and enable the aspiring youths to be gainfully employed or self-employed, Sikkim ENVIS Hub has been successfully implementing GSDP on four certified courses of NSQF level 4 and 5 viz (1) Forest Fire Management- 300 Hrs, (2) Bamboo Crafts - 400 Hrs, (3) Beekeeping - 200 Hrs and (4) Solar Energy Systems- 240 Hrs since 2019-20 in the state of Sikkim:

- Out of 425 GSDP successful trainees in four courses viz Forest Fire Management, Bee Keeping, Bamboo Crafts and Solar Energy Systems during 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22, a total of 359 candidates have been employed/ self-employed in respective sectors so far making employability rate of 84%.
- During the FY 2021-22 alone, Sikkim ENVIS Hub enrolled 250 candidates in the above four GSDP courses in 12 batches. So far 194 out of 250 candidates have already started livelihood ventures through beekeeping, bamboo crafts, solar energy systems and forest fire management. Figures are being updated on continuous or on as and when basis.
- Sikkim ENVIS Hub has successfully set up partnership with resource and enterprise agencies such as Sikkim Marketing Federation (SIMFED), Directorate of Handloom and Handicraft, Sikkim Khadi and Village Industries Board, JFMCs/ EDCs, Disaster Management and Mitigation entities, Sikkim Renewable Energy Development Agency (SREDA) and other government and autonomous entities for supporting the green skilled candidates for their employment, entrepreneurship and marketing ventures post training.
- GSDP programme in Sikkim State has received righteous attention amongst the unemployed youths and is now closely monitored as one of effective welfare schemes directly by the Chief Minister's Office as well. The office of Account General(Audit) Sikkim during the performance audit of ENVIS for period 2016 to 2022 has commended the livelihood generation activities through GSDP as commendable achievement and has advised other divisions of the Forest and Environment Department(Host organization) to follow the same.
- Sikkim ENVIS Hub has been recently provided a marketing space for popularising GSDP products such as bamboo crafts, honey and beekeeping products, organic manure and briquettes out of Forest fire Management course, Solar PV installation outsourcing/ skilled manpower resource etc. This is the country's first GSDP marketing outlet under ENVIS scheme and was inaugurated on 7th of March 2022 by the Hon'ble Minister Forest Shri Karma Loday Bhutia and Sr. Economic Adviser, MoEF&CC Shri Arun Kumar. The sale through the outlet after inaugural as on 31st March 2022 was recorded as Rs 67,300/- directly benefitting the GSDP beneficiaries.
- Sikkim state's first registered Beekeepers Cooperative in the name of "Himali Bee Cooperative Society Ltd" was registered by 10 GSDP Beekeepers of South Sikkim who had successfully completed the course recently. An inaugural programme organized in grandeur in a remote village Rabitar at South Sikkim on April 6, 2022 witnessed the inaugural of bee apiary with over 30 colonies by the chief guest on the occasion the Hon'ble Minister Agriculture Shri L N Sharma in presence of political dignitaries, govt officers, farmers and local public. A Historic day for GSDP Beekeeping in Sikkim.

Status of GSDP Courses of FY 2021-22 as on 31.03.2022

- Sikkim ENVIS Hub has successfully implemented GSDP on four certified courses in 12 batches viz (1) Forest Fire Management 3 batch, (2) Bamboo Crafts 4 batch, (3) Wild Beekeeping and Processing -2 batch and (4) Solar Energy Systems 3 batches during 2021-22 in the state of Sikkim
- All 12 batches have been successfully completed as on 26th February 2022. All courses were started on 15th of November 2021.
- Total 250 candidates were enrolled and all candidates have completed training successfully. Out of 250 candidates enrolled, 100 are ST, 19 are SC, 131 are OBC. Male and female ratio has been checked appropriately as 134 and 117 respectively.
- Total 555 applications were received in a window period of two weeks of advertisement for FY 2021-22.

iv. Extension & Outreach Programmes:

Sikkim ENVIS Hub has been conducting regular awareness and sensitization activities for general public and various target groups across the State. Following activities have been conducted during the current FY 2021-22:

- Awareness on curbing Single Use Plastics under Azadi ka Amrit Mahostav on weekly basis since 12th of March 2021. Various activities have been conducted for 55 consecutive weeks during FY 2021-22 in association with local stakeholders such as School Eco-Clubs, ULBs, NGOs and local associations etc.
- Under Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat Programme, Sikkim is paired with Delhi state, for which with
 collaborative efforts of Delhi and Sikkim based ENVIS centres various activities such as virtual
 interactive meets, online competitions, preparation of knowledge products, online surveys/ polls
 are being conducted on environment days like WED, Ozone Day, Menstrual and Hygiene day,
 Wildlife conservation day, National Bird Day, National Girl Child Day, World Wetlands Day and
 so on.
- About 10 webinars on various topics such as Covid and environment, earthian educators, sustainability education, climate action, phasing of SUPs, plastic waste management have been organized so far in which more than 5000 students, research scholars, ULBs, NGOs and other stakeholders participated.
- Online competitions such as quiz, essay writing, photography, short video contest, painting have been organised on two occasions viz World Environment Day (June 5) and Ozone Day (September 16) inviting 7000+ participants. E-certificates and cash prizes up to Rs 30,000 to best entries were supported by host organization. Appreciating the initiative of Sikkim ENVIS Hub, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Sikkim Shri P S Tamang during state function on July 7, 2021 presented added cash incentives to all awardees (total 27 persons).
- Physical and social media outreach activities such as plastic pick up campaign, phasing of SUPs, signature campaign, harit Diwali swasth Diwali clean air campaign, broadcasting of jingles in FM and Radio, swachhta pakwada, social media campaigns through broadcasting of AV messages of the Hon'ble Minister Forest Shri Karma Loday Bhutia in Facebook and YouTube channel have been conducted on regular basis on environment days.

✓ Country's first GSDP Marketing Outlet under ENVIS scheme inaugurated at Gangtok: Sikkim ENVIS Hub facilitated and conducted 12 fresh batches of green skill training to 250 candidates under Green Skill Development Programme (GSDP) during 2021-22 alone on four certificate courses viz. Wild Beekeeping and Processing, Forest Fire Management, Sustain and Enhance Technical Knowledge in Solar Energy Systems and Bamboo Crafts. A total of 250 candidates were trained, out of which 194 candidates are already entrepreneurs/ self-employed /in job as on 31.03.2022. A marketing outlet at a strategic location at the periphery of Forest Secretariat at Deoarli, Gangtok was inaugurated on 7th of March 2022 by the Hon'ble Minister Forest Shri Karma Loday. ✓ GSDP Beekeepers first cooperative society, first of its kind in the state of Sikkim, gets officially registered under Cooperation Department in the name of "Himali Bee Cooperative Society Ltd" by 10 GSDP beekeepers of South Sikkim who had successfully completed the green skill training course during January 2022. An inaugural programme was organized in grandeur in a remote village Rabitar at South Sikkim wherein a bee apiary with over 30 colonies was inaugurated by the chief guest on the occasion, the Hon'ble Minister Agriculture Shri L N Sharma in presence of other political dignitaries, government officers, farmers and local public. A Historic day for GSDP Beekeeping in Sikkim.







State level Online Competitions complimented by the State Government: Online competitions such as quiz, essay writing, slogan writing, photography, short video contest, painting were organized for different age categories engaging students, youths and general public on two occasions viz World Environment Day (June 5) and Ozone Day (September 16) inviting 7000+ participants. Certificates and cash prizes up to Rs 30,000 to best entries were supported by host organization. Appreciating the initiative of Sikkim ENVIS Hub, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Sikkim Shri P S Tamang during state function on July 7, 2021 presented added cash incentives to all awardees (total 27 persons). Webinar competitive on advantage of adopting solar power for Industrial Units of Sikkim organized: In order to stimulate industrial and job oriented stakeholders partnership for GSDP Solar trainees with the industrial setup at Sikkim State, a webinar was organized with the Industrial unit heads competitive advantage of adopting solar power by Sikkim ENVIS Hub in collaboration with the State Pollution Control Board Sikkim on July 9, 2021. • Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav activities on propagation of Green Good Deeds for 55 consecutive weeks during 2021-22: Awareness and propagation of Green Good Deeds focusing on curbing SUPs for 75 weeks to commemorate 75 years of India's independence under Azadi ka Amrit Mahostav has been ongoing on weekly basis since 12th of March 2021. Various activities have been conducted for 55 consecutive weeks during FY 2021-22 in association with local stakeholders such as School Eco-Clubs, ULBs, NGOs and local associations etc. An iconic week was also celebrated during October 4-10, 2021 with activities such as signature campaigns on green pledges, webinars on ill-effects of SUPs and finding alternatives, social media campaigns, broadcasting of jingles and AV messages of dignitaries in FM/Radio/Local TV network, online competitions, banner and hoarding displays, clean up drives, plantation drives, water and energy conservation drives, street plays, capacity building activities of local stakeholders, propagation of ENVIS knowledge products and so on.



✓ Outreach Activities for curbing Single Use Plastics and drafting/ finalization of State Policy – Ban on Plastic Packaged Water Bottles: The campaign was hugely propagated through online and offline mode reaching about 55000+ people of different age groups of urban and rural community. The online competitive event organized alone was participated by over 10,000 youths. Awareness through webinars reached more than 20,000 students, a ppt on SUP was shared amongst 800+ eco-club at schools and colleges. About 20 local associations and ULBs was mobilized for mass public participation (approx. 20000) including producers, marketing agencies, distributors and consumers on the ill-effects of SUPs and its need for proper management and disposal. Around 5000 participants across the state also actively took part in the riverfront, roadside plastic litter pick up campaign. Sikkim ENVIS Hub in coordination with mutli-stakeholder partnership drafted the policy on state-wide ban on plastic packaged water bottles as a pollution abatement measure and compiled views, suggestions and comments from general public and submitted to the government for policy decision.

Impact/ Outcome: The campaign reached over 20 rural and urban communities across the state; Around 1500 sets of masks, gloves hand sanitizers were distributed to poor under privileged and frontline/ safai karmacharies/ local volunteers; workers; About 60 sets of green and blue bins for waste segregation were installed at public places across the State; The plastic litter pick up campaign organized through public participation across the state collected and safely disposed about 4000kg of plastic litter from along roadside, drains, riverfront, trek trails; 1000 mainline taxi vehicles were provided garbage bags; More than 10,000 persons took part in the signature / green pledge campaign; The funds for this campaign was supported through Swachhta Action Plan 2021-22; Sikkim as a state was effected with state-wide ban on plastic packaged drinking bottles up to 2 litters from1st January 2022; The campaign resulted in promoting eco-friendly alternatives to SUPs such as bamboo and other bio-degradable products through the GSDP Marketing Outlet which was indurated on March 7, 2022.



✓ EK Bharat Shrestha Bharat Programme conducted: Under EBSB programme Sikkim ENVIS Hub partnered with Delhi based ENVIS Hubs/ RPs to enhance interaction and promote mutual understanding between people of different States/UTs through the concept of State/UT pairing. To carry out activities under the programme, ENVIS Hubs and RPs at Sikkim and Delhi through mutual consultation and mutual engagement conducted virtual interactive meets, prepared knowledge products and jointly conducted sensitization and awareness drives to generate the vibrancy of understanding and appreciation amongst the people and forged mutual bonding, thus securing an enriched value system of unity in the nation. Interactive meets, webinars, survey and opinion polls, photography and short video contests, preparation of propagation of knowledge products on culture, wildlife, wetlands, birds biodiversity, hygiene and sanitation, energy conservation, climate change issues etc were conducted on environment calendar days such International Biodiversity Day, World Menstrual Day, National Bird Day, Wetlands Day, Wildlife Conservation Day, World Forestry Day and so on.



✓ Green Campus Audit conducted: Sikkim ENVIS Hub has established a green audit framework for facilitating self and joint assessment of educational institutions (schools and colleges) of the state. During 2021-22, a green audit assessment and reporting was done for Nar Bahadur Bhandari Government College, Tadong, Gangtok for the period 2016-2021. The purpose of the green audit was to

identify the best practices and provide recommendations to the college authority for an effective environment management system in terms of current practices and green policies followed to improve the quality, usage, sustainability of Land, Air, Water, Energy and Waste Resources within the campus. The green audit is a requirement of NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) assessment of the colleges for UGC accreditation.



✓ **Performance Audit achievement:** The office of Principal Account General (Audit), Sikkim conducted performance audit of Sikkim ENVIS Hub activities for the period 2016 to 2022 i.e till FY 2021-22. The audit certificate presented by the audit officer on 21/04/2022 is placed under. Appreciating the livelihood based activities of ENVIS in creating self-employment through GSDP training programs such as beekeeping, bamboo crafts, forest fire management and solar energy systems, the other divisions of the host organization i,e Forest and Environment Department, Government of Sikkim has been suggested to follow the methods adopted by ENVIS to provide green skill training to assure livelihood security.

Marketing Outlet of GSDP Beneficiaries at Forest Secretariat Inaugurated

The Honourable Minister Forest Shri Karma Loday Bhutia and Shri Arun Kumar, Senior Economic Adviser of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India today inaugurated the GSDP marketing outlet of Sikkim ENVIS Hub at Forest Secretariat premises in Deorali, Gangtok. The inaugural function was also attended by Chief Conservator of Forest Shri N W Tamang, Conservator of Forest (Territorial) Shri Karma Legshey, Director of Forests Shri B B Gurung, Director of Science & Technology Shri D. T. Bhutia, Joint Director Mrs Kusum Gurung along with team of Sikkim ENVIS Hub and about 60 GSDP beneficiaries and subject experts from across the state.

The marketing outlet featuring the products of Green Skill Development Programme includes bamboo crafts, organic honey and beekeeping tools, briquettes, organic manure and skilled manpower resources for outsourcing services for solar PV installation and so on. The products displayed for sale in this outlet are prepared by green skilled manpower from rural communities. The outlet intends to provide marketing opportunities to these beneficiaries for generating a source of livelihood through sustainable development initiatives. So far 425 local

youths, school dropouts and farmers from Sikkim State have been benefitted through the Green Skill Development Programme under the ENVIS scheme funded by the Ministry.

Speaking on the occasion, the Minister expressed gratitude to the Ministry for the continued support and encouraged the beneficiaries to continue producing marketable products by harnessing the green skills acquired. Sikkim ENVIS Hub has been implementing four GSDP courses namely forest fire management, beekeeping, bamboo crafts and solar energy systems since 2019-20.

Shri Arun Kumar, Senior Economic Adviser of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change who is on a two day visit to Sikkim ENVIS Hub also interacted with the GSDP participants and took stock of ENVIS activities in the State. Appreciating the overwhelming feedback from the GSDP participants and Sikkim ENVIS team Shri Arun Kumar in his address mentioned that the objectives of the ENVIS scheme are being delivered to satisfaction.

Subject experts such as Biodiversity and livelihood expert Dr Bharat Kumar Pradhan, Dr Tika Prasad Sharma, Shri Tseten Tashi Lepcha also spoke on the importance of ENVIS scheme in the state and highlighted its contribution in several R&D activities through publication of knowledge products, information dissemination, livelihood support activities and so on, all forming important part of environment conservation and protection activities in the state.

Earlier, the dignitaries during the inaugural of marketing outlet also presented 100 garbage bags for mainline taxi vehicles through the Indira Bye Pass Taxi Driver's Association as a part of ongoing Plastic Waste Awareness Week. The dignitaries also launched the signature campaign on green pledges as a part of the campaign steered Sikkim ENVIS Hub, Forest and Environment Department.



The post lunch session was followed by visit to the office of Sikkim ENVIS Hub, wherein a detailed discussion through presentation on ENVIS activities was made. The Senior Economic Adviser interacted with ENVIS officers and staff and took stock of **ENVIs** knowledge status products, ISBEID database. outreach activities conducted. of funds status and achievements of ENVIS so far. The Senior

Economic Adviser appreciated the efforts and activities conducted and remarked that Sikkim ENVIS Hub has been befittingly been owned up by the state host organization and the state government.

The Senior Economic Adviser then also visited the ENVIS Resource Partner on "Ecotourism" at Science and Technology Department, wherein ENVIS activities on the designated theme was discussed and elaborated by the team. 





19. ENVIS Output-Outcome Details and its Impact over past five (5) years:

Major Achievements of Sikkim State ENVIS Hub

- 1. Received National Award as 'Best State ENVIS Centre 2014-15' from the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change. Sikkim ENVIS was tagged as 'GURU CENTRE' during 2012-13 by the Ministry to take a lead role in providing assistance to other ENVIS network of the country.
- 2. Sikkim ENVIS Website hosts major publications of the government such as State of Environment Report, State Environment Plan, Climate Change of Sikkim, Biodiversity of Sikkim, Rapid Biodiversity Surveys, collection of Journals and Scientific Papers, Environment Initiatives/Policies of the State Government, etc.
- 3. The implementation of Environment Education, Awareness and Training amongst school eco-clubs have brought several national awards to Sikkim Schools conferred by reputed agencies like CSE, CEE and WIPRO on annual basis since 2002.
- 4. Active coordination and implementation of 'Chief Minister's Green School Rolling **Trophy and State Green School Awards**' since 2011. The award carrying cash prizes up to Rs 12 lakh (funded by the State Government) is being presented to eight schools annually on the occasion of World Environment Day on 5th of June.
- 5. Sikkim ENVIS Hub has been partnering with other reputed agencies like WIPRO, IIT Bombay, CSE, New Delhi for pooling of resources including funds for supporting and promoting environment information, education, awareness and training in the State.
- 6. Sikkim ENVIS special publication titled 'PANDA' has gained popularity for its resourceful content and is wide disseminated across the country, national library and son.
- 7. Sikkim ENVIS Hub is a resource agency for several research programmes in the State and has aided in drafting State Action Plan for Climate Change.
- 8. GSDP courses aligned with Sikkim ENVIS Hub has empowered the centre to reach rural populace of the State with livelihood schemes such as Beekeeping, Bamboo Crafts, Forest Fire Management and Solar Energy Systems.
- 9. So far out of 425 successful GSDP trainees, 359 have been self-employed/ employed in respective sectors making GSDP employability rate of 84%.
- 10. Sikkim ENVIS Hub has also opened country's first GSDP Marketing Outlet for providing marketing ventures and first month sale was over sixty thousand providing direct dividends to the candidates.
- 11. State's first beekeepers cooperative society with apiary of over 30 bee colonies has been registered by 10 GSDP beekeepers.
- 12. Owing to being a vast repository of State's environmental information, Sikkim ENVIS HUB was assigned to prepare White Paper of the host department in 2017-18 and 2018-19 for submission to the State Legislative Assembly.
- 13. Sikkim ENVIS Hub has been a resource centre for the central and state government along with several research based organizations including research scholars for aiding in research studies, policy and decision making, drafting state action plans etc.

Sikkim ENVIS Hub successfully conducted above four GSDP courses in 12 batches enrolling 250 candidates during last FY 2021-22, out of which 192 candidates were self-employed/employed in relevant sectors by 31st March 2022. During the current FY 2022-23, Sikkim ENVIS Hub proposes to conduct the above four GSDP Courses in 14 batches enrolling 300 candidates considering the number of waitlisted candidates and demand for the courses.

3. Proposed Activities in alignment with Vision @2047 for Lifestyle for Environment (LIFE) - Promoting sustainable lifestyles:

- a. To participate, implement and coordinate with grassroots/local communities through engagement of local stakeholders/ associations for generating mass awareness, outreach on sustainable practices such as local air quality management, water conservation, waste management, propagation of Green Good Deeds, involvement of local communities in policy decision making, promoting local climate action and so on
- b. To document and propagate ecological traditions/ Indigenous Traditional Knowledge.
- c. To promote ecofriendly lifestyles in rural and urban communities focusing activities on environment calendar days or other occasions.
- d. To propagate Green Actions/ Green Good Deeds amongst citizens and engage public participation in polls/ surveys and other online and offline medium.
- e. To promote capacity building, green skilling to the local communities, youths on traditional and scientific sustainable practices to promote Lifestyle on Environment (LIFE).
- f. To engage ENVIS knowledge and information resources in **Community-driven Environmentally Sustainable Village Programme (CESVP)** for promoting sustainable alternatives such as bamboo handicrafts/ products, forest by-products, practice of 3'R's to curb the use of Single Use Plastics/ Non-Degradable products etc.
- g. To provide marketing opportunities of local produce, organic produce and enhance rural livelihood.
- h. To facilitate and support engagement of green skilled manpower resource in creation of small scale enterprises through establishment of cooperative societies/ SHGs for further promoting of sustainable livelihood opportunities in beekeeping, bamboo crafts, forest fire management and solar energy systems.

4. National Environment Survey - Grid Based Decision Support System (NES-GRIDSS) and ISBEID:

- a. Secondary data collection of State and District level ISBIED and NES-GRIDSS parameters.
- b. Preparation of 9x9 km and 5x5 km grid based thematic maps on standard environmental parameters incorporating data and analytic reports/ trends on forest fires, human wildlife conflicts, air quality, water quality, wetlands status and so on.

5. Facilitation, Extension & Other Outreach programmes:

- a. To conduct open Citizen Poll on selection of State Butterfly of Sikkim. The poll will facilitate environment enthusiast across the globe to vote for state butterfly of Sikkim in a true democratic manner. The activity will be conducted in close coordination with Forest and Environment Department and consortium of experts.
- b. To facilitate data compilation on Status of Forest Nurseries in state and provide support to the host organization and the State Government in selection of best entries for the State Awards to be conferred on June 5 or July 7, 2022.
- c. To facilitate Green Schools Audit and Assessment of School's environment action for selection of best schools for Chief Minister's Green School Rolling Trophy and State Green Schools Award to be conferred on June/July 2022.
- d. **Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav:** Commemoration of 75 years of India's Independence by conducting 75 week long awareness activities which started on 12th of March 2021 and ends on 18th of August 2022. For this, weekly activities are being conducted for propagation of 75 Green Good Deeds in coordination with School Eco-Clubs, NGOs, local associations, Stakeholders and line departments.
- e. **Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat programme:** Sikkim State will be partnering with Delhi State in sharing of traditional knowledge, information, best environmental practices and success stories in coordination with Delhi based ENVIS Centres, School Eco-Clubs and line departments. Activities such as webinars, virtual meets, e-publications, posters etc will be prepared and conducted in line with official themes on environment calendar days.
- f. Propagation and implementation of Swachhata activities such as riverfront clean up, clean up Teesta Campaign, Zero Waste Himalaya, plastic litter free campaign, bring back waste from nature visits,

- jhora/ nallah clean up, plastic litter pick up campaign, waste quantification in collaboration with urban and local bodies across the state.
- g. To participate and conduct Swachhata Pakhwada, Poshan Pakhwada or other fortnightly events with social media campaign, short video campaign, broadcasting of AV/ jingles, posters, pamphlets, signature campaigns, online opinion polls etc. for sensitization of general public on local and global environmental issues.
- h. To support the host department in environment awareness programmes in the State like World Environment Day, A Day for Mother Earth, World Ozone Day and so on with events and activities such as online competitions (quiz/ essay writing/ painting/ photography/ short videography etc), webinars, virtual meets and preparation of knowledge products like brochures, handbooks, posters, flyers, signages, hoardings etc.



PRESS RELEASE: The Honourable Minister Forest Shri Karma Loday Bhutia and Shri Arun Kumar, Senior Economic Adviser of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India today inaugurated the GSDP marketing outlet of Sikkim ENVIS Hub at Forest Secretariat premises in Deorali, Gangtok. The inaugural function was also attended by Chief Conservator of Forest Shri N W Tamang, Conservator of Forest (Territorial) Shri Karma Legshey, Director of Forests Shri B B Gurung, Director of Science & Technology Shri D. T. Bhutia, Joint Director Mrs Kusum Gurung along with team of Sikkim ENVIS Hub and about 60 GSDP beneficiaries and subject experts from across the state.

The marketing outlet featuring the products of Green Skill Development Programme includes bamboo crafts, organic honey and beekeeping tools, briquettes, organic manure and skilled manpower resources for outsourcing services for solar PV installation and so on. The products displayed for sale in this outlet are prepared by green skilled manpower from rural communities. The outlet intends to provide marketing opportunities to these beneficiaries for generating a source of livelihood through sustainable development initiatives. So far 425 local youths, school dropouts and farmers from Sikkim State have been benefitted through the Green Skill Development Programme under the ENVIS scheme funded by the Ministry.



Speaking on the occasion, the Minister expressed gratitude to the Ministry for the continued support and encouraged the beneficiaries to continue producing marketable products by harnessing the green skills acquired. Sikkim ENVIS Hub has been implementing four GSDP courses namely forest fire management, beekeeping, bamboo crafts and solar energy systems since 2019-20.

Shri Arun Kumar, Senior Economic Adviser of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change who is on a two day visit to Sikkim ENVIS Hub also interacted with the GSDP participants and took stock of ENVIS activities in the State. Appreciating the overwhelming feedback from the GSDP participants and Sikkim ENVIS team Shri Arun Kumar in his address mentioned that the objectives of the ENVIS scheme are being delivered to satisfaction.

Subject experts such as Biodiversity and livelihood expert Dr Bharat Kumar Pradhan, Dr Tika Prasad Sharma, Shri Tseten Tashi Lepcha also spoke on the importance of ENVIS scheme in the state and highlighted its contribution in several R&D activities through publication of knowledge products, information dissemination, livelihood support activities and so on, all forming important part of environment conservation and protection activities in the state.

Earlier, the dignitaries during the inaugural of marketing outlet also presented 100 garbage bags prepared by Sikkim ENVIS Hub for mainline taxi vehicles through the Indira Bye Pass Taxi Driver's Association as a part of ongoing Plastic Waste Awareness Week (March 6-12). The dignitaries also launched the signature campaign on green pledges as a part of the campaign steered Sikkim ENVIS Hub, Forest and Environment Department.




Report on the Sale from the GSDP Marketing Outlet during March 2022 after inaugural



The GSDP marketing outlet of Sikkim ENVIS Hub is located at a strategic location near inter-state taxi terminus at Deorali, Gangtok. The marketing space has been allocated by the Forest and Environment Department in its office premises at the peripheral unit of Forest Secretariat D-Block. This makes tourist and commuters to stopover at the store to explore and buy gift items, mementos, household items of bamboo and other products such as organic Himalayan honey and so on. The marketing outlet which was inaugurated on March 7, 2022 and made some impact on boosting the rural economy of GSDP beneficiaries.

During its first month of operation i.e till 31st March 2022, the outlet could record the sale of Rs 67500 making sale profit of about Rs 12500. The outlet is run and managed by one the GSDP trainee of 2021-22 batch Mrs Brijita Darjee under the support of Sikkim ENVIS Hub. The marketing outlet is rented at Rs 900 per month (Rs 30 per day) payable to the SBFP Cell of the Forest and Environment Department. The sale and earnings from this outlet provides direct benefit to the GSDP beneficiaries who have been populating the outlet with their products. As on 31st March 2022, the GSDP candidates populated the outlet with products worth over Rs 2,36,000/-.



Currently the outlet is equipped with retail marketing only and marketing is done through small scale enterprise as many of the candidates are also marketing their products themselves at local level through bazaar haats, melas, exhibition, trade fair etc. In time to come, with growing success, the outlet could be brought in public domain through e-marketing for which proper marketing licensing may be required to be obtained from concerned authorities.

Sikkim ENVIS Hub under the aegis of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India hosted at Forest and Environment Department, Government of Sikkim successfully implemented the Green Skill Development Programme 2021-22 on "Value Addition and Marketing of NTFP Products (Animal Origin): Wild Beekeeping and Processing", a certificate National course with Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) level 4 for 50 candidates in two batches selected from amongst 123 applicants across the State.



A 200 Hrs duration GSDP training programme on Beekeeping was conducted for 50 candidates in two batches at various training sites w.e.f November 29, 2021 to January 13, 2022. The training was organized with theoretical and field based hands-on exercises to develop green skilled workers duly amalgamating scientific and traditional approach for sustainable development of rural economy. The training provided hands-on knowledge and understanding about beekeeping and processing vis-à-vis ways of conversation and effective farming system in order to diversify rural livelihood opportunities through marketing of honey and its products in a sustainable manner. The course aimed to green skill the grassroots to maintain honey bee health, its productivity and explore the possibilities and considerations of how one can both profit from and contribute to the success of these amazing pollinators with a sustainable approach.

2021-22 batch of training inducted 50 aspiring candidates basically unemployed youths/ unskilled farmers having urged for bee farming. Common native species of bees such as *Apis cerana* subsp. *cerana*, *A. cerana* subsp. *himalayana*, *A. dorsata*, and *A. laboriosa* were the primary bee species handled during a month-long training programme. Along with the hands-on training, each candidate was provided with scientific wooden bee box, basic tools and clave hives along with bee colonies as a startup.

This pool of 50 GSDP trainees are now skilled **beekeepers/ honey farmers**, **apiarists** or **apiculturist.** The green skilled certified beneficiaries have successfully set up bee apiary in their respective premises for sustainable practice of honey extraction and marketing of honey for livelihood support. This green skilled workforce will be tracked for three years with the support of the collaborating agencies such Farmers Producer Organization (FPQ), Mission Organization Value Chain Development –North Easrten Region (MOVCD-NER), Sikkim Marketing Federation (SIMFED), Agriculture, Horticulture and Cooperation Departments. On the marketing front, the honey fetches about Rs 1200 to Rs 1800 per kilogramme and this brings enough incentive to a beekeeper. About 10 to 16kg of honey is harvested in one season from one bee box. A scientific bee box can yield honey for marketing at least two seasons. Honey finds easy passage in the local market where the demand has always been higher than the supply.

Evaluation of Trainees: Candidates were continuously evaluated on weekly basis by a set by 50 questions taken through in-person interaction and hands-on/practical demonstration.

Green Skill Development Programme on Beekeeping (for both 1st and 2nd batches) started on 29/11/2021 with a 2-day given basic orientation on Biodiversity Conservation and climate change, Opportunities for Green Skill Development, bees and food security, beekeeping and understanding honey bee species, life cycle and morphology, bee products by experts Dr. Bharat Kumar Pradhan, Scientific Associate from Sikkim State Biodiversity Board, Shri Shiva Sharma, Bee Expert from Sikkim Khadi and Village Industries Board and Mr Youl Rai, Bee Expert from Rateypani South during the indoor theoretical session held at Sidekoeng Tulku Forest conference Gall, Deorali, Gangtok.



Trainees were given insight on scientific bee keeping practices where honey extraction for marketing ensures that the bee colony remains intact without damaging the egg cells/brood and the colony. As in traditional practice, most bee keepers in sake of honey extract the entire hive along with the brood which disturbs the colony in which bees are chased away with smoke. While in scientific approach, the brood is not

disturbed and the honey production frequency is enhanced to 4 cycles in a year while in traditional practice honey extraction in only once a year.



Beekeeping trainees are escorted to local bee apiaries at Nalam, Rateypani and Salghari in South Sikkim and Ganchung in East Sikkim where traditional bee keeping practices were observed. To understand the benefits of scientific management of beekeeping for extraction of pure honey, conservation of bees and its propagation through pollination and crop production, site with traditional bee hives mostly in logs and bee hives from the wild were selected for capturing and shifting through sustainable and scientific approach. For this outdoors/field based orientation on understanding the bee behaviour and climate patterns for setting up bee colony scientifically in layered bee boxes made of wood and clay were imparted.

















Month—long training mostly included hands-on-exercise in regard to bee capture, shifting of bee colony, apiary management, and preparation and installing of bee hives in scientific wooded boxes, preparation of clay hive, bee disease management, cleaning of bee colony, cleaner production and waste minimization, bee colony separation, grafting, queen cell preparation sustainable practices for honey extraction and marketing.

Trainees were also oriented on various state and central loan schemes under small scale marketing enterprises for setting of entrepreneurship as bee keeper or apiarist.



3. Implementation of GSDP Course: Forest Fire Management 2021-22 Note: More detailed report is submitted separately





Sikkim ENVIS Hub under the aegis of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India hosted at Forest and Environment Department, Government of Sikkim successfully implemented the Green Skill Development Programme 2021-22 on "Forest Fire Management", a certificate course with National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) level 5 of 300 hours duration for 60 candidates in three batches of 20 each selected from amongst 181 applicants across the State.

A month-long training programme per batch for three batches was organized starting from November 15, 2021 and concluded on February 19, 2022 for all three batches. The course was organized with theoretical and field based hands-on exercises to develop green skilled workers duly amalgamating scientific and modern approach for control and management of forest fires through sustainable activities such as composting for development of organic manure and preparation of briquettes for marketing as a support to livelihood. The training was imparted by experts from Forest and Environment Department at Khasmal RF and other forest locations of Phodong at North Sikkim, Paiyong at South Sikkim and Nayabazar-Zoom at West Sikkim.

The GSDP course on Forest Fire Management broadly aimed to provide a comprehensive understanding and basic skill in handling of forest fires and pursuing livelihood opportunities through management of forest by-products, briquette making, preparation of organic manure, degradable plates from dry and fallen leaves and so on. The course was imparted also to explain the causes and the effects, impacts of forest fires, forest degradation and its impact on ecosystem, forest fire safety tips, forest fire monitoring, fire dousing techniques etc. The course facilitated development of forest disaster preparedness, mitigation & management, leadership among individuals at the ground. The candidates are now able to contribute in generating awareness and up-gradation for sustainable development in the community.

The area of interest for the training was Khasmal RF and other forest locations of Phodong at North Sikkim, Paiyong at South Sikkim and Nayabazar-Zoom at West Sikkim. All these regions are prone to forest fires in dry autumn season due to its proximity to the district highways and the inter-linking roads. It was felt imperative to target these areas for creating a pool of forest fire fighters, trainers and ambassadors to save the natural forest of the State.



Hon'ble Minister Forest Shri Karma Loday Bhutia inaugurated GSDP Course 2021-22 on Forest Fire Management on November 15, 2021 at Forest Conference Hall, Gangtok. He also handed over training kits to the trainees.



Success Indicator: Out of total 60 candidates, 30 have been engaged as Fire Watchers in Joint Forest Management Committees (JFMCs), as Environment Assistants in Environment and Soil Conservation Divisions for Forest Fire reporting and management assistance services to Forest Department. Remaining 30 candidates are seeking opportunities in JFMCs of their villages and have remained unemployed as on 31-Mar-2022. All the trainees have started collecting dry leafs for composting to prepare organic manure, bio-mass fuel/ briquette for marketing. More than 3km forest line has been created for avoiding and controlling fires at RF areas along district highways. Compost pits for collecting fire/ fuel agents like dry leaves and making organic manure have been set up at several RF locations. Biomass fuel or the briquette preparation was successful. The organic manure is consumed at Rs 20-30 per kg in local market while the briquette is being at Rs 10 to Rs 20 per piece through the GSDP marketing outlet of Sikkim ENVIS Hub.

Training activity involved the participants to prepare compost from sal leaves using cow dung and using organic waste decomposer; all male participants actively participated in preparing the compost pit and the female participants collected the sal leaves. Three compost pit of size 10' X 5' each was prepared at training sites. The natural manure and other forest byproducts were used in making biomass fuel/ briquettes.

4. Implementation of GSDP Course: Sustain and Enhance Technical Knowledge in Solar Energy Systems 2021-22

Note: More detailed report is submitted separately



Sikkim ENVIS Hub under the aegis of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India hosted at Forest and Environment Department, Government of Sikkim successfully implemented the Green Skill Development Programme 2021-22 on "Sustain and Enhance Technical Knowledge in Solar Energy Systems", a certificate course with National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) level 5 of 240 hours duration for a total of 60 candidates selected from amongst 135 applicants.

A month-long training programme for 60 trainees in three batches of 20 trainees each was conducted w.e.f November 15, 2021 to December 31, 2021 at Gangtok and other industrial sites. The training included theoretical and field based hands-on exercises to develop green skilled workers duly amalgamating scientific and modern approach for development of solar energy systems and its maintenance for harnessing green skills for capacity building for employment in solar energy sector which is perceived as trending energy solutions for climate action.

The course meticulously covered solar energy concepts, basic electrical principles and their usage, solar PV modules, practical knowledge of types, sizes and specifications of modules/panels and their handling, functioning of solar photo voltaic power plant both off-grid and on-grid, solar water heater or solar geysers and its components. The training programme aimed to bridge the gap between theoretical learning and hands-on implementation of knowledge with requisite technical expertise for detailed Solar PV plant designing, installation and maintenance. The course aimed to promote entrepreneurship and served as base for livelihood development.

Total 60 candidates were enrolled for this GSDP course. Sikkim ENVIS Hub collaborated with State Designated Agency (SDA) and Sikkim Renewable Energy Development Agency (SREDA), an autonomous government body of the State Power and Energy Department as a chief collaborator and employing agency. The core part of the training was conducted by three experts from Global Sustainable Energy Solution (GSES), New Delhi with other subject experts from Sikkim Manipal Institute of Technology (SMIT) and National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (NEILIT) Gangtok along with local solar technicians and solar vendors.







Evaluation of Trainees: Candidates were continuously evaluated based on written assignments and practical understanding through feedback. An online quiz was held at the end of day's session on daily basis wherein winner of the quiz on daily basis were presented solar diyas. Final assessment of candidates was conducted through written exams. The cumulative marks obtained was derived and candidates scoring 80% above were given solar diya (15 nos each). All other candidates scored 60% and above and hence were also given solar diya (10 nos each).







Officers and subject experts interacting with the trainees as a part of continuous monitoring and evaluation

Success Indicator: All 60 trainees successfully demonstrated the design and installation of 1.3 KW Solar PV off grid plant at Forest Secretariat premises. Trainees were given opportunities to explore larger solar PV stations of hybrid, on-grid system at industrial unit of CIPLA Unit II at Rorathang and Forest Secretariat premises. Trainees also explored marketing and services opportunities including solar products, site design, installation, operation and maintenance. Out of 60 trainees, 32 candidates (as on 31-Mar-2022) have started working in relevant sector under power department as technician and engineers with average salary of Rs 18000 per month. 2 local candidates are self-employed as solar technicians and have started services. Remaining 28 candidates are being tracked continuously.
