REPORT SUMMARY:

The Government of Sikkim has taken a number of new environment initiatives. They range from innovative concepts like 'A Day for Mother Earth' to be celebrated on 7th of July every year, banning of plastic water bottles up to 2 litres, novel initiatives like 'Sikkim Shishu Samridhi Yojana' under 'Mero Rukh Mero Santati' aimed at planting 108 trees to commemorate the birth of a child and opening of a fixed deposit account in the name of the child, 'Mero Bato Mero Bot' for greener and beautiful roads mobilizing mass avenue plantation drives along with other programmes like creation of nurseries in school to name a few. In order to provide an umbrella platform, mass involvement and enhanced focus on forestry and environment activities, the State Government celebrates the period from 1st July to 14th July every year as "Sikkim Paryavaran Parva".

The theme for 2025 is "Leave a Green Legacy".

The activities being steered by Forest and Environment Department across the State during this period include:

01.07.2025: Launching/ Flag-off event at Maitri Manjari Park / Ridge park premises. *Events*: Curtain raiser, flag-off of mobile seedling distribution vans, signature campaign on LiFE pledge, Greenathon (5k Green Walk and 10K Green Run, Green Ride). *All are invited!!*







01.07.2025 **07.07.2025:** Celebrating Santati to **Saptah.** Intensive plantation under #MeroRukhMeroSantati - planting 108 trees for every new born in Sikkim, mass plantation with tagline "#MeroBaatoMeroBot" and under #Plant4Mother #EkPedMaaKeNaam. Community clean-up drives and sensitization campaigns. Free distribution of seedlings, plantation and cleanup drives engaging dignitaries, other government departments, industrial units, NGOs, local associations, schools, youths and public.

01.07.2025 to 14.07.2025: Fortnight-long Activities

FLAG OFF PROGRAM | 1st July 2025

Forest Department organized "Greenathon" - Run for Green Sikkim" as a part of Sikkim Paryavaran Parva. Organized at Maitreya Manjri Park, Gangtok, the 5K Green Walk and 10K Green Run was organised as a part of 14-day-long Sikkim Paryavaran Parva from July 1-14.



SIKKIM PARYAVARAN PARVA celebrated from 1st -14th July, 2025 was flagged off by the Hon'ble MLA at Maitreya Manjri Park premises on 1st of July 2025. This was the third edition of the festival anchored by the Forest and Environment Department. This

comprehensive initiative is based on the firm commitment to preserving our planet and fostering a sustainable future. It aims to address pressing environmental challenges and promote responsible stewardship of our natural resources Several innovative and impactful initiatives were planned in the fortnight, these include free distribution of seedlings, large-scale plantations, conserving endangered species, cleanup drives, curbing use of single use plastics, promoting zero waste and sustainable lifestyles, quiz, essay and poem competitions, green reels competition, sustainable workshop, water conservation birding rejuvenation, responsible solid waste management workshop, skits, clean air campaign, Paryavaran rallies, green walks, Greenathon and many others.









A Day for Mother Earth was celebrated in a grand manner on 7th July and the Santati Saptah from 7-14th July, 2025. The Santati Saptah is a part of the *Mero Rukh Mero Santati* (**MRMS**) initiative of the state government where 108 plants will be planted to celebrate every child birth.

This Parva was celebrated for the third time and strived to create a greener and more sustainable world by engaging individuals, communities, and organizations, to foster a collective sense of responsibility towards our environment and inspire positive change.

A Short flag off program was followed by signature campaign with Mission LiFE pledge: Mission LiFE pledge has been successfully completed in all departments across the state.

Greenathon (5K & 10K): Green Run / was held with starting & ending point at Ridge Park entrance.

The 3rd edition of Sikkim Paryavaran Parva was inaugurated by Hon'ble MLA Mr. Aditya Golay, Soreng Chakung, Constituency at Maitreya Manjri Park, Gangtok District with support from the EIACP Hub. The 14-day festival (July 1–14), themed "Leave a Green Legacy," will be observed across all six districts of Sikkim, featuring plantation drives, Green Walk, Greenathon, rallies, workshops, and awareness programs.

A total number of 288 participants took part in the 5k Green Walk and 10k Green Run today. The Geenathaon included route from Ridge Park to Swastik Burtuk and back through the same route. The top three podium position of 5k Green Walk and 10k Green Run are as follows:

THE GREEN QUIZ

The EIACP Hub successfully facilitated the Green Quiz, a televised environmental quiz show comprising seven engaging episodes. This inspiring initiative was supported by the State Pollution Control Board, Sikkim, in collaboration with Sikkim Chronicle, with the aim of fostering environmental awareness among students. Following a highly competitive preliminary round involving 91 senior secondary government schools and a total of 182 participants, Tharpu Government Senior Secondary School emerged as the winner, demonstrating outstanding knowledge and a strong commitment to sustainability. The quiz celebrated youth leadership, environmental consciousness, and the power of informed minds. The episodes were televised from prominent venues including Sikkim Chronicle Studio, Janta Bhawan, and Manan Kendra in Gangtok District.









A DAY FOR MOTHER EARTH

7 Minute State wide Vehicular Halt was observed during Paryavaran Parva 2025 on 7th of July 2025 across the state. Sikkim Traffic Police facilitated the initiative wherein, as part of Paryavaran Parva steered by the Forest & Environment Department of Sikkim organized a state wide vehicular halt on July 7, 2025, from 11:00 AM to 11:07 AM. This seven-minute pause aimed to raise awareness about vehicular emissions and reduce carbon footprints.











THE GREEN WALK

The Forest and Environment Department, Government of Sikkim, organized its annual "Green Walk" on 11th of July 2025 promoting environmental awareness and sustainable living.

The walk commenced from Titanic Park and concluded at the Forest Secretariat in Deorali, symbolizing the department's commitment to eco-friendly practices. Minister Pintso Namgyal Lepcha actively participated in the event, walking alongside department officials and staff to emphasize the importance of adopting environmentally responsible habits in daily life. SIKKIM PARYAVARAN PARVA OBSEVED AT SORENG DISTRICT

The 'Sikkim Paryavaran Parva', themed "Leave a Green Legacy", was launched in Soreng District to promote environmental sustainability and public awareness. Running from July 1st to 14th, the program includes diverse activities such as plantation drives, cleanliness campaigns, workshops, cultural performances, and competitions. Notable events featured the planting of saplings, a symbolic 7-minute traffic halt, and skits promoting the "Mero Rukh Mero Santati" initiative.

The Environment Week Celebration, observed from 1st July to 14th July 2025 under the event Sikkim Paryavaran Parva- "Haryali Saptaha" and "Santati Saptaha," commenced with an impactful tree plantation drive aimed at promoting environmental awareness and greenery. The event was graced by the presence of Hon'ble MLA Shri Erung Tenzing Lepcha, the Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM), CLC President Shri Jit Hang Subba, officials from the Forest Department (SAF), BDO, RO, and several other dignitaries and community leaders. Sikkim's Environmental Quest: 3rd Paryavaran Parva Ends on High Note at Manan Kendra

Gangtok, July 14 (IPR): The Forest & Environment Department organised a State-Level culmination function of the fortnightly environment festival, Sikkim Paryavaran Parva 2025 with the theme "Leave a Green Legacy" at Manan Kendra, this morning.

The 3rd Sikkim Paryavaran Parva was observed from July 1 to July 14 throughout the State.

The Chief Minister, Mr Prem Singh Tamang, graced the event as the Chief Guest. Upon arrival, he visited an exhibition titled 'Transforming Lives Through the Winds of Change,' which showcased various initiatives implemented across the state since the inception of the Sikkim Paryavaran Parva. The exhibition highlighted the impactful projects and developments that have taken place as part of this initiative.

In his address, the Chief Guest expressed his deepest condolence for the demise of Padmashree Garud Singh Lama (Sanu Lama), a successful creator of the Nepali literature world and skilled lyricist who is recognised for having written the State Song, 'Jahan Bagchha Tista Rangit.'

The Chief Guest reflected on the Paryavaran Parva's successful culmination, which began on July 1 with a "Greenathon". The festival featured a range of events, including 'A Day for Mother Earth' on July 7 and a notable seven-minute vehicle stoppage across Sikkim to promote environmental awareness and reduce carbon emissions. Emphasising collective responsibility, the Chief Guest highlighted the importance of protecting the environment and







wildlife, underscoring the celebration's role in strengthening spiritual, cultural, and social bonds with nature.

The Chief Guest also cited achievements key such as: - Representing India at COP28 in Dubai (2023) with initiatives like 'Mero Rukh Mero Santati' **'Shishu** Samriddhi and Yojana' Winning the **SKOCH** Award 2024 for 'Mero Rukh Mero Santati'

- Sikkim being declared Best State in Environmental Education 2025

- Designation of Khecheopalri Lake as Sikkim's first Ramsar Site.

The Chief Guest emphasised the efforts in banning single-use plastic and related products, inspiring national policies in line with the global theme of 'Ending Plastic Pollution.'

He also spoke about the inclusive community-driven initiatives such as:
- 'Mero Rukh Mero Santati': Planting 108 trees per newborn with government support of Rs 10,800/- per child
